

Cheryl Regehr Early Career Teaching Award: Examples of Impact

As part of the summary of teaching related achievements, nomination packages should address at least two of the four ECTA criteria that are applicable to the nominee's teaching practice, including evidence of the impact of their contributions. Examples of impact may take multiple forms, and may include but is not limited to:

- Evidence of student learning and achievement (e.g., performance on assessments, attainment of learning outcomes, skill development)
- Evidence of sustained or improved outcomes following curricular or pedagogical changes
- Indicators of student success and progression (e.g., retention, completion, pursuit of further study or careers)
- Student feedback (e.g., course evaluations, testimonials, reflective statements) demonstrating engagement, learning or satisfaction
- Student participation in enriched learning opportunities (e.g., research, community-engaged projects, experiential learning)
- Recognition of teaching effectiveness (e.g., teaching awards, nominations)
- Adoption or adaptation of teaching approaches, courses or resources by others
- Evidence of meaningful impact within local communities, including outreach, partnerships and expanded access to educational opportunities
- Dissemination and uptake of teaching practices (e.g., invitations to present, workshops, publications, or use by other institutions)
- Qualitative or quantitative data demonstrating the reach or influence of initiatives (e.g., number of students impacted, program-level changes)
